On November 1st, the Benefice of Bride Valley and Benefice of Abbotsbury, Portesham and Langton Herring came together to form a new benefice, 'The Benefice of Bride Valley and Chesil'. Each church will still be a parish and responsible for its every day running. One of the first tasks the new benefice will undertake together will be to appoint a new Rector following the departure of Rev'd Jane Williams. To do this, a profile for the new Benefice has been prepared which will be available to all priests who express an interest in the post. The interview for the new Rector will hopefully take place in the New Year.

In the new Benefice, there are new colleagues to get to know and work with, including Reverend Margaret Preuss-Higham. She lives at Portesham and works part-time - on *Tuesday, Thursdays and Sunday services*. Margaret says; 'I trained at Sarum College, was ordained priest in 2011 and was associate priest NSM with pastoral care for Holy Trinity at Bothenhampton before I came to be House for Duty for Abbotsbury, Portesham and Langton Herring in January 2015. I was Rural Field Officer for 2 years and I sit on the Sherborne Mission Oversight group. Rural ministry is my passion'.

The Chesil churches also have two retired clergy and a Lay Worship Leader.

For the moment, all enquiries about Baptisms, Marriage and Funerals should come to the Bride Valley administrator Helen Fry for the Bride Valley Churches and Reverend Margaret Preuss-Higham for the Chesil churches. However, Margaret and Helen will be in regular contact as we work out how we move forwards together as a new Benefice.

Bride Valley Gardening Club

Too much to do

There always seems to be something more urgent to be done when my boxes of bulbs arrive, or so I convince myself. Quite often the bulb catalogues begin to arrive soon after the Chelsea Flower Show and although I know I should, I cannot begin to



contemplate spring bulbs just as summer fast approaches. This means of course that I only revisit choosing bulbs as the autumn is upon us and even then I'm often slow to order.

If you haven't yet discovered the wholesale department of Parkers (www.dutchbulbs.co.uk) do have a look. Minimum quantities apply, often starting at 25 but prove excellent value so worth considering combining an order with a friend.

I lift in the weighty box that is delivered and sit it on my gardening table where it is quickly forgotten. Later, wrenching apart the heavy staples holding the box together and daring to peek inside I'm immediately daunted by the sight of many perforated or brown paper bags inside - and wonder at my own foolishness: 25 large firm narcissus, each requiring a good size hole; 100 little scilla bifolia, smaller holes but so many to do; 100 muscari, yet more small holes and how they do add up, no wonder I put off planting! I push the box around in the garage and play for time, revisiting my planting plans, but getting started requires great motivation and it is a good thing to live in a relatively mild part of the country which helpfully extends the window of opportunity. In theory daffodils should have a long season to establish meaning planting in September but my late efforts still seem to yield good flowers in the spring. An even later order, this time mostly for tulips, means I pay the price for my tardiness and first choices are often unavailable. Never mind, I can be even slower getting these into the ground and pots as they really prefer a cold winter planting and I've been known to keep this chilly task as a reward after the Christmas and New Year festivities are over. These orders always include an element of 'topping up' favourites to ensure some interest from early February. Crocus, Iris reticulata, scilla and muscari get the new season off to a good start, followed by the usual favourites well into May when the alliums burst out like fireworks. No mention of snowdrops I hear you say - but that's another story!

Our Night Sky in November 2023

Saturn will be setting at about 22.30 followed by Jupiter at about 04.30. Both will have given us great pleasure throughout the winter evenings. As always, Orion will travel across the night sky during Winter.



Last month, I told you about the recovery of the spacecraft that brought back samples from the Asteroid Beppo. It has now been opened and the scientists were amazed and delighted with the quantity of dust and rock which it had gathered. Initial sample analysis revealed indications of water-based compounds and also carbon rich material. All these compounds are essential for life on Earth, so this is the first time that there is evidence that these materials now found on this planet, could have originated in the asteroid bombardment that took place in the early history of the Solar System. Meanwhile, NASA has launched a spacecraft to the metal-rich asteroid Psyche, and I will try to keep you informed of how that has gone.

Bride Valley Book Club Review

Cloud Cuckoo Land by Anthony Doerr

This is a long and multilayered novel with five narrators and set over a range of time periods from the sacking of Constantinople in 1453 to a voyage into space in the future. Doerr is trying to recreate for our own times the lost novel of Ancient Greek writer Antonius Diogenes 'Wonders beyond Thule' - 24 tales of world travel known only through a later plot summary. In it Aethon a shepherd is on a quest to find the fabled paradise in the sky and during his adventures is transformed into a donkey, a fish and a crow. All the narrators finds solace in this book in Doerr's story. Each chapter plunges the reader straight into the action and the characters are vividly portrayed. Along the way, we encounter a gay Korean War veteran and POW, an autistic boy, a teenager in space and a farm boy conscripted with his oxen to join a besieging army. The descriptive writing is excellent and although long, this novel is richly rewarding. Doerr says that one of his aims was to produce a book about the love of reading and libraries and in this he certainly succeeds. Several book group members are now keen to read his Pulitzer Prize-winning novel "All the light we cannot see" - currently being dramatised on Netflix.

Thursday 30 November, LIVING, 'a quirky, beautifully observed film'

The story of an ordinary man, reduced by years of oppressive office routine to a shadow existence, who at the eleventh hour makes a supreme effort to turn his dull life into something wonderful – into one he can say has been lived to the full. In 1953 a London shattered by WWII is still recovering. Williams (Bill Nighy), a veteran civil servant, is an important cog within the city's bureaucracy as it struggles to rebuild. 



The Rectory St James the Least of All



My dear Nephew Darren,

Carol singing is not what it used to be. My fond memories of a group of choristers, muffled in scarves and overcoats, carrying lanterns, and walking from door to door in the snow, as they sang 'While shepherds watched ...' had to be suddenly revised when I saw your own music group, in T-shirts inscribed with 'Jesus loves You', singing 'Little donkey', in your shopping centre. I suspect any money you raised would just about have paid for the electricity used to power your banks of electronic equipment. Singing in the main square of the Centre next to the fountain may have looked good, but it seemed to mean that the choirmen were obliged to make constant trips to the lavatory.

Here at St James the Least of All, carol singing is regarded as a staff perk for the choir; the year when the Boys'

Brigade tried to break their monopoly was suppressed with a ruthlessness that would have impressed Genghis Kahn. Our annual carol-singing route involves months of meticulous planning. We find that a transparent collection box is vital, so that donors can see what earlier patrons have given. This means that those who are bound to put in notes must be visited first - 'pour encourager les autres'. It also needs a detachable base, so that if coppers are given, they can be removed from sight before the next call.

Those homes that contain several children are visited just after bedtime, so that parents will give generously simply to get the choir to go somewhere else. Veiled threats to stay and sing more carols (unless they give generously) are usually very effective. Getting whoever looks the most innocent and photogenic to ring the bell and ask for money is a far more subtle way of ensuring a donation than planting any number of mafia lookalikes (such as our church treasurer) on the doorstep.

The choir always finishes its evening at the local pub - but again, the timing must be carefully managed. Too early and there will only be the landlord, his wife, and their Labrador to listen; too late and people will be so full of Christmas cheer that any carols will be hi-jacked and become the equivalent of back-of-the bus rugby songs.




