

Week commencing 2 February

- As previously advised today from 8am to 5pm (6 February) we are carrying out signage installation works under lane closures between East Road and Loaders Cross.
- 6 February will also be the final overnight closure (8pm to 6am) between Northbrook Junction and Stinsford Roundabout, reopening on the morning of 7 February. There will be no closure on the night of 7 February. A signed diversion route will be in place throughout.

Week commencing 9 February

- From 9 – 13 February (8am to 5pm) we will be carrying out signage installation works under lane closures at Kingston Russell Dips.
- From 9 – 11 February (8am to 5pm) we will be carrying signage installation under lane closures at Dorchester Bypass.
- On 12 February (8am to 5pm) there will be one lane closed for traffic approaching the roundabout to Charmouth.
- From 9 – 15 February three-way temporary traffic lights will be in place at Shedbush Lane, Morecombe Lake for civils improvement work.

Week commencing 16 February

- From 16 – 20 February (8am to 5pm) we will be continuing signage installation works under lane closures at Kingston Russell Dips.
- From 16 – 22 February three-way temporary traffic lights will remain in place at Shedbush Lane, Morecombe Lake for civils improvement work.

Additional information

- Temporary traffic lights currently in place on the A35 at Compton Vallance, installed due to flooding, will remain. Groundwater levels continue to be exceptionally high, and the lights will be removed once conditions improve.
- All works are subject to weather conditions and site constraints.
