The latest news on our local buses and trains

Route 6: This continues to take up most of WATAG's time. From 3rd April:

The **0747** Schoolday trip from Bridport to Beaminster/**0800** Non-Schooldays trip from Bridport to Monmouth Gardens will both operate **ten minutes earlier** throughout. The **0830** Schoolday and Non-School days trip from Monmouth Gardens to Bridport will operate **10 minutes earlier** throughout. The **1700** trip from Bridport Community Hospital to Monmouth Gardens will operate **ten minutes later** throughout. The timetable to 31st March is here: https://bit.ly/3kP3loK

AVMTbuses A

AVMT operates a service, Mondays to Fridays from Lyme Regis to Seaton. For the winter, there is a maximum of two services per day. The timetable is here: https://bit.ly/3PrhBOa. S The **Weymouth-Dorchester-London operates twice daily**. Timetable: https://bit.ly/3lZ2UZF. You must book in advance, either via the website or at Bridport Tourist Information Centre, where no booking fee is charged. At the time of publication, there is still no date for Bridport services resuming although the National Express website states 2023 as a planned return to Bridport and Raymond's Hill.



Megabus has announced a return to Weymouth from 27 March. Operating **four buses a day** from Weymouth to London via Poole, Bournemouth and Heathrow. This will include an overnight service in each direction. Bookings via https://uk.megabus.com/ The service is run by a company called Air-Sym, who are based at Heathrow and have a fleet of electric buses. It is unclear if these will operate from Weymouth, although electric buses now have the range to do so.

WEST BAY BUS STOP UPDATE

(by The George Hotel) First Wessex has announced that the shelter has been demolished as it is deemed unsafe. Customers should instead use the temporary bus stop between the original bus stop and St. John's Church. Work to replace the original shelter will begin in the autumn, by Dorset Council. **ENGINEERING WORKS**

Government funded scheme operates until 30 June 2023

The eye-watering fare increases from First Wessex have been mitigated somewhat by a current government scheme where all single fares are £2.00. This applies to services where no change is necessary.

This means in practice that a direct bus from Axminster to Dorchester is £2. If a change of bus is required in Bridport, the fare would be £4.00 (£2.00 for each bus used). In either case, a significant saving is offered.

On 17th February it was announced that the scheme would be extended to 30 June, there are calls for the scheme to be extended further to encourage more bus use.



A Grand Day Out - Part 3

Bridport to Beaminster, Crewkerne and Yeovil

In a previous issue we highlighted some of the towns and villages on the X52/X53 route from Bridport to Axminster.

We now head north, using the 6 which operates, Mondays to Fridays, to Yeovil. On Saturdays the CB3 bus operates to Crewkerne.

Leaving the market town of Bridport, our bus heads down South Street - a picturesque street full of independent shops, eateries and three pubs. (The George, The Greyhound (side entrance) and The Woodman. Apart from the cars, pictures of South Street from 100 years ago show the same recognisable buildings.

The bus then heads along Sea South South before reaching St. Andrews Road towards Beaminster. If you have time, to be sure to stop off at the Half Moon Inn, Melplash, a local pub serving excellent food. The writer can confirm this!

We are now in Somerset - Crewkerne, an historic and attractive stone built country Market Town in the South

Somerset Hills, Crewkerne has its origins in Saxon times.

Yeovil, a large town in Somerset has everything you need when it comes to shops - with a wide range of high street stores and independent options. Yeovil is also home to the Octagon Theatre, home to the Yeovil Literary Festival and a plethora of other musical and theatrical events, including an annual pantomime. Sadly bus times do not permit

visiting an evening show by public transport.

The countryside around Beaminster is beautiful with lush green fields as far as the eye can see. Beaminster is a pretty town with a host of eateries and pubs.

Try Ollerod, a restaurant specialising in locally sourced ingredients, or three pubs - The Red Lion, The Greyhound and the independent Knapp Inn.

Add in some delightful cafes like Cilla & Camilla, The Trading Post, Tangerine Café and Brassica, local walks and Beaminster Museum (open April to October) and you have a grand day out! Do check opening times before you leave!
